Australia is retuning



Some TV channels are changing their frequency as the final step in the move to digital-only TV. You'll need to retune your TV, set-top box or digital recorder when these changes happen in your area. If you don't, you won't be able to receive all free-to-air digital TV channels.

The retuning for Manning River is September 3.

How to retune

If you are watching TV via an antenna, you will need to retune your equipment to keep receiving all the digital TV channels. Some equipment will automatically detect changes to the TV channels and retune itself or it may prompt you to retune.
